The Vintage: The preceding winter, which marked our second consecutive drought year, featured the lowest rainfall total in our entire history, going back to 1968. The vines grew vigorously during the warm and dry spring as the vineyard team did an excellent job with early weed control and irrigation. The summer months, from June through September, were all cooler than average, which slowed down the ripening process and allowed for fantastic flavor development. The yields were lower than usual, given the drought conditions, but the resulting wines are all excellent and reflect our unique location in the Oak Knoll District at the cooler southern end of Napa Valley.

The wine is crisp, with lovely aromas of lemon, jasmine, white peach, and lavender. On the palate, the bright acidity is supported by flavors of honeydew melon and citrus, delivering a refreshing finish.

Vinification: The grapes are harvested by hand and carried to the cellar, where they are destemmed, selected through a vibrating sorting table and finally crushed. The alcoholic fermentation takes place inside truncated-conical oak vats, with a maceration of 15-20 days, depending on the vintage. The wine is refined in tonneaux and bottles until completely aged.

Tasting: Deep colour with purple shades. Its nose is very intense, balsamic, and complex, with blackberry and blueberry notes, while the long ageing determines the tertiary notes of coffee, chocolate, and spices. On the palate it has a warm and enveloping entrance with an impressive tannic structure. Very persistent finish with a pleasant fruitiness.

The wine spent 14 months on yeast lees building further texture and complexity before being racked out of barrel and bottled in June 2022 with no fining and minimal filtration.

The Wine: Scents of white peach, ripe grapefruit, and citrus blossom combine with toasty/nutty oak aromas to produce a complex and engaging bouquet.

The wine is rich and concentrated in the mouth yet remains focused and composed with outstanding persistence and length of flavour. All parcels were kept separate throughout the winemaking process. Hand-picked, hand sorted, destemmed, and crushed, except for 25% of the fruit from the Angels Rise parcel, which remained as whole bunches in the ferment. Cold macerated for a week prior to gentle warming, encouraging ferment to start naturally. The wine remained on skins for 14 days before basket pressing and decanting to French oak puncheons. The final assemblage was carefully made in early October 2020. Bottled without fining or filtration.
